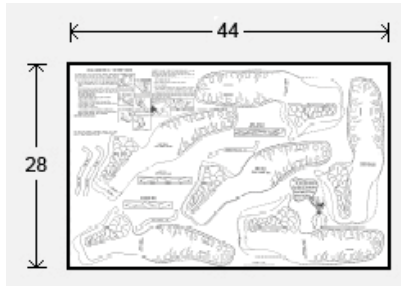




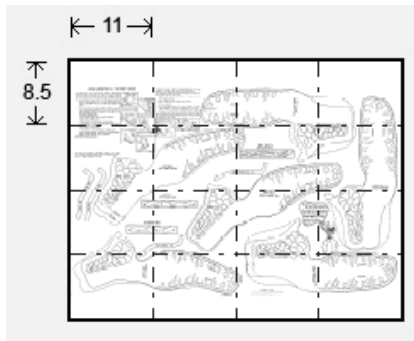
Pattern Digital Download

This PDF file contains 1 (one) full pattern package. The PDF has been put together to give you options when it comes to printing. Pages and patterns that are larger than 8½x11 have been provided in two formats:



1) Full Size

If you would like to have a full size print out, take the full size pages to your local print shop and they can print it for you.



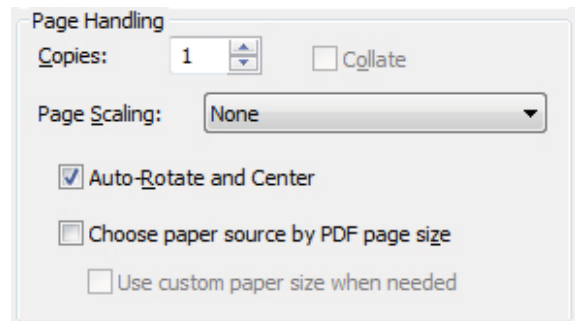
2) Tiled

The tiled pages give you the option of printing the larger patterns at home. You print the tiled pages and then assemble them to make the larger patterns.

The pattern PDF files are typically laid out like this:

Cover(if applicable), instructions sheets (if applicable), pattern 1 – full sized, pattern 1 – tiled, pattern 2 – full sized, pattern 2 – tiled, pattern 3 – full sized, pattern 3 – tiledetc

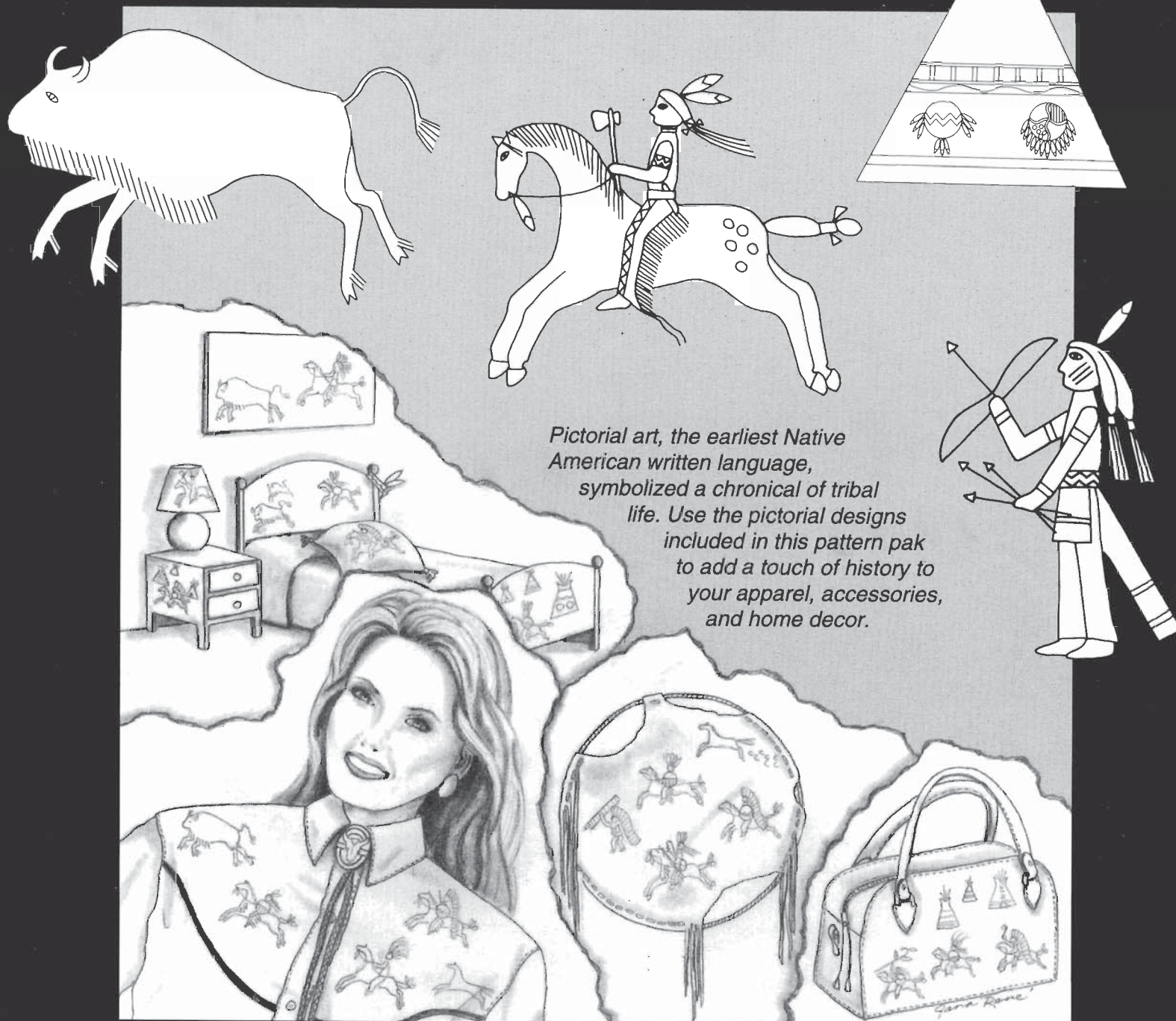
Please note: When printing on a home printer, use the settings seen on the image to the right in the Page Handling area of the Adobe Reader print dialogue box. If your printer is cutting edges off, set “Page Scaling” to “Shrink to Printable Area”. This will, however, decrease the size of the pattern a very small amount.

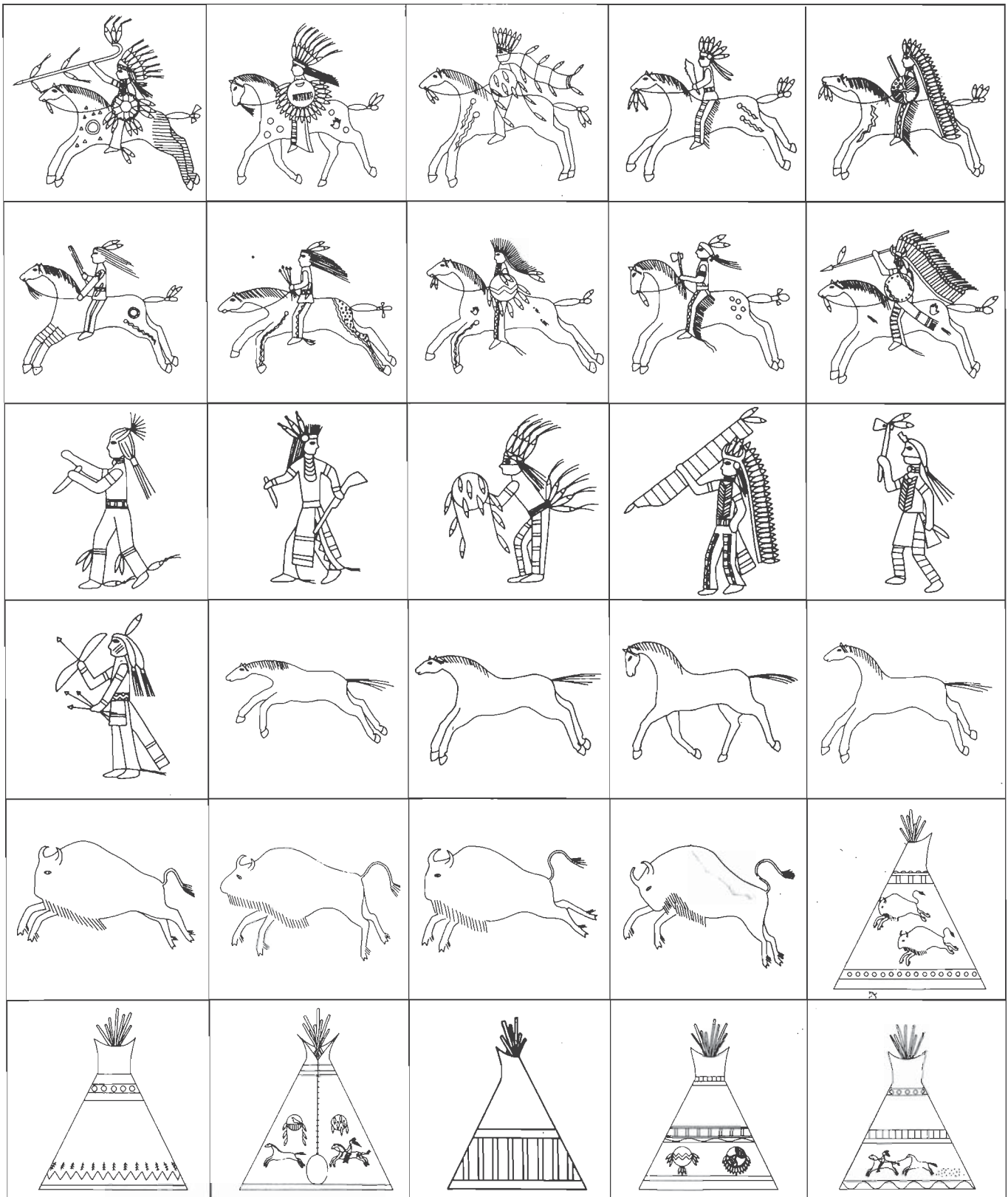

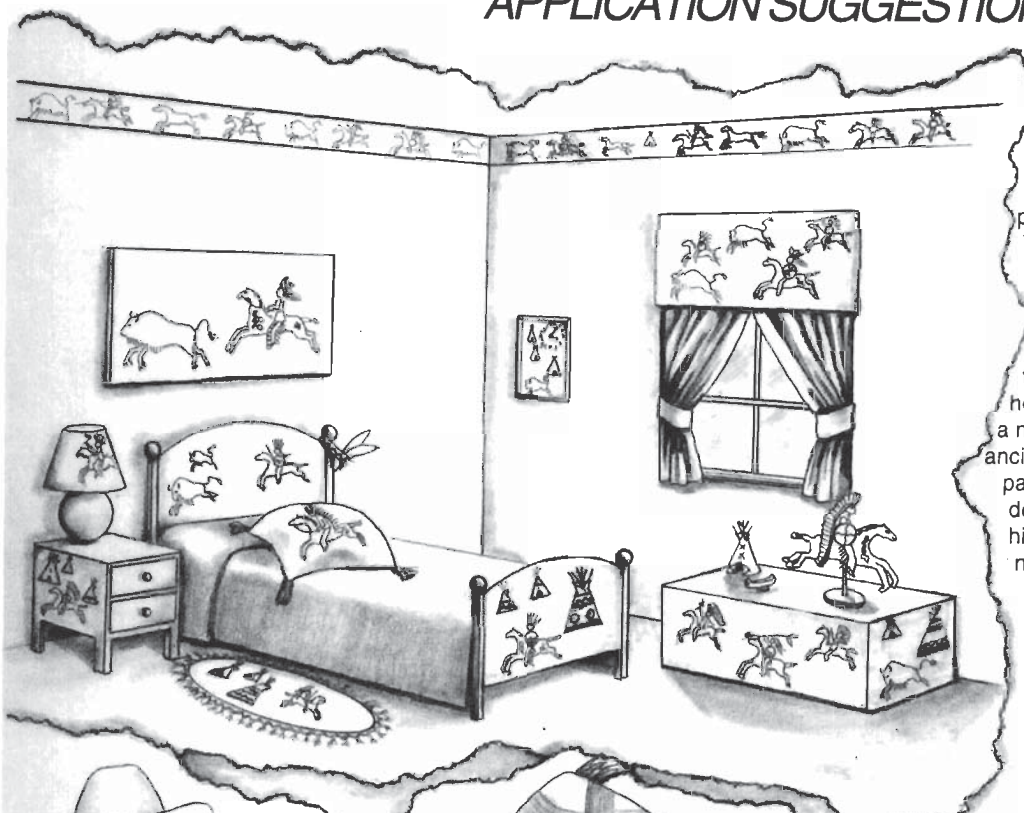

APPLICATION SUGGESTIONS



Pictorial art, the earliest Native American written language, symbolized a chronicle of tribal life.

Special events such as inter-tribal conflicts and personal victories were recorded on animal skins. The drawings were filled with symbolism. An

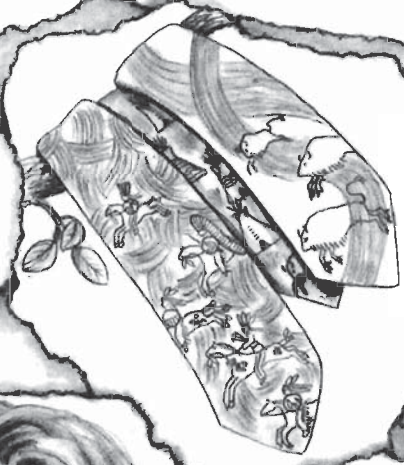
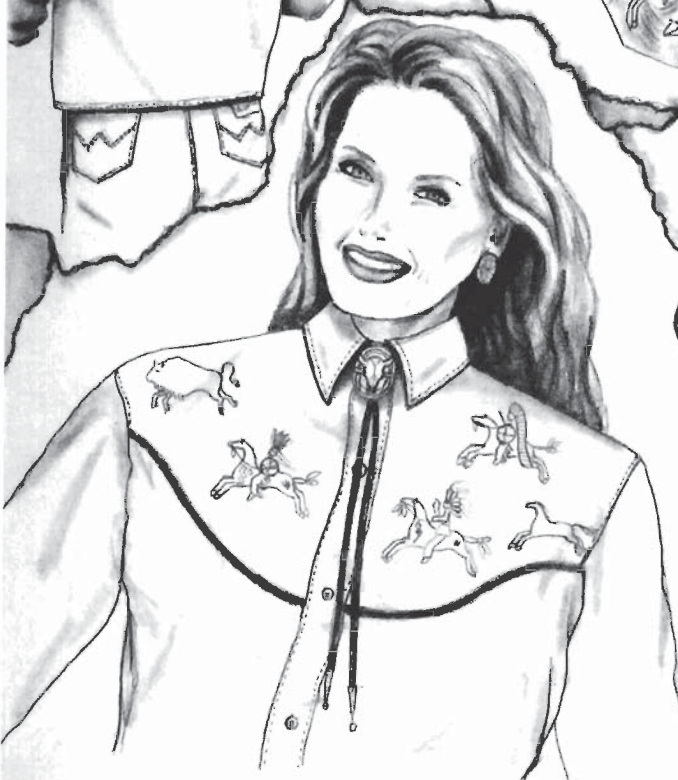
individual could be identified by an object in the drawing associated with that person. A cavalry man's horse or a horse without a rider could be identified by its free flowing tail, Indians typically tied their horse's tails up for battle. A single horse, could symbolize many horses by drawing a multitude of hoof prints behind it. Inspired by this ancient art of recording history, this collection of patterns is sure to intrigue the imagination while you decorate and personalize your designs. The colors historically used were limited to those derived from nature. As modern pigments became available, a broad spectrum of colors were used. You need not be limited by the ideas listed here, let your imagination run free.

- Turn a child's room into a place of adventure and discovery, the shapes and colors will entice the imagination. Items shown include a wall border, window valence, painting on canvas, wall clock, lamp shade, furniture, pillow, wooden sculpture on stand, and rug.

- Customize apparel with a designer's touch, such as this jacket and shirt.

- Make one of a kind memorable accessories. Items shown include a hair barrette, hand bags, and ties.

- Native American style items such as this drum and mandala will arouse interest and add a dramatic touch of history to one's home.
