



## Doodle Page Digital Download

This PDF file contains 1 (one) Doodle Page. The PDF has been put together to give you options when it comes to printing. Pages and patterns that are larger than 8½x11 have been provided in two formats:



### 1) Full Size

If you would like to have a full size print out, take the full size pages to your local print shop and they can print it for you. All full size Doodle Pages are 11x17



### 2) Tiled

The tiled pages give you the option of printing the full sized Doodle Pages at home. You print the tiled pages and then assemble them to make the larger patterns.

The Doodle Page PDF files are typically laid out like this:

Front – full sized, front – tiled, back – full sized, back – tiled

(Some Doodle Pages do not have backs)

Please note: When printing on a home printer, the edges may get cut off. To avoid this, make sure “Page Scaling” is set to “Shrink to Printable Area” in the Adobe Reader print dialogue box. This will decrease the size of the Doodle Page a very small amount.



You may take this PDF file to your local print shop to have the full-size pages printed for your own personal use.

Note the combination of figure carving and set stamps are high-lighted with the swivel cut bird. The frame for the horse and bull heads created with but two tools, the shell and veiner. The Arizona morning glory made with smooth shell No. 922 and ribbed shell No. 748. The scalloped petals (lower right) resulting from use of the smooth crowner Craftool No. 728 thus eliminating both the swivel cutter and the beveler.

Note, too, that the lower center flower and all scroll edges were pinked with the No. 707 shell and the three flower seed areas were formed with the large camouflage No. 455. Study the free flowing decorative cuts all made with the Craftool hollow ground blade, conclusive proof that it takes good tools to do good work. Look for the name Craftool Co. stamped on every saddle stamp.

TIP. The Polyethylene bags used for food in deep freezer lockers are ideal for casing leather. These air tight bags raise the humidity and allow the wet leather to sweat and become plump and mellow.
