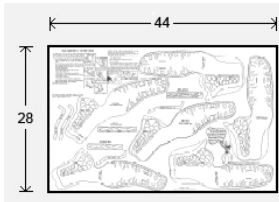




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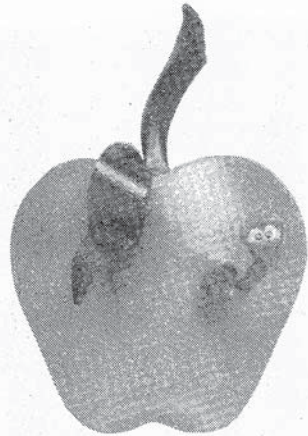
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# From Tony Laier's Bench: Christmas Apple Ornament

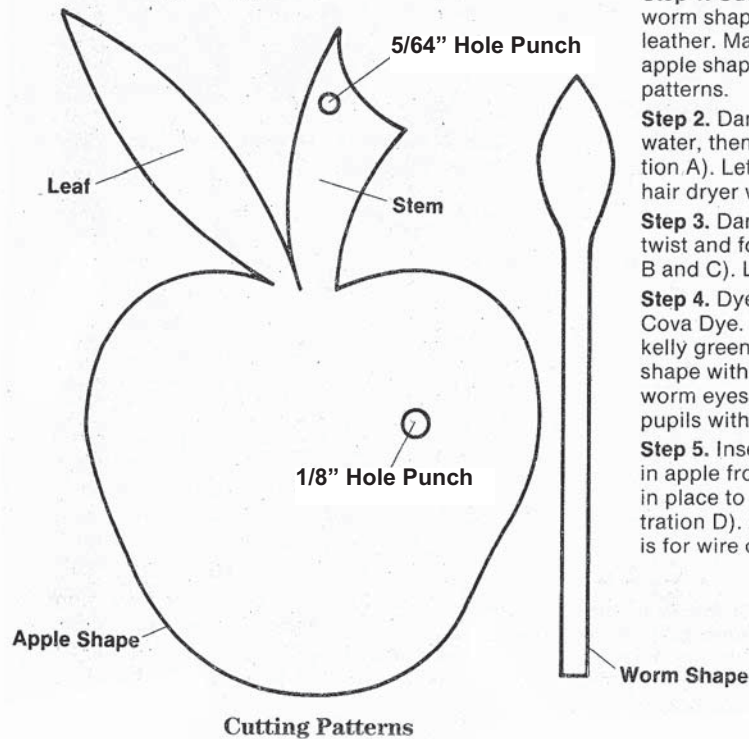


## Apple Ornament

### Materials you will need:

4 to 5 oz. tooling leather  
5/64" & 1/8" Hole Punch  
Leathercraft cement  
Red, kelly green, light green, white and black  
Cova Dye®



### INSTRUCTIONS:

**Step 1.** Cut one apple shape and one worm shape out of 4 to 5 oz. tooling leather. Mark, then punch holes in apple shape where shown on cutting patterns.

**Step 2.** Dampen apple shape with water, then mold as shown (Illustration A). Let dry completely. NOTE: A hair dryer will speed drying time.

**Step 3.** Dampen worm shape, then twist and form as shown (Illustrations B and C). Let dry completely.

**Step 4.** Dye apple shape with red Cova Dye. Dye leaf and stem with kelly green Cova Dye. Dye worm shape with light green Cova Dye. Dye worm eyes with white Cova Dye and pupils with black Cova Dye.

**Step 5.** Insert back of worm into hole in apple from the front side. Cement in place to back side of apple (Illustration D). NOTE: Small hole in stem is for wire ornament hanger.
