

Doodle Page Digital Download

This PDF file contains 1 (one) Doodle Page. The PDF has been put together to give you options when it comes to printing. Pages and patterns that are larger than 8½x11 have been provided in two formats:



1) Full Size

If you would like to have a full size print out, take the full size pages to your local print shop and they can print it for you. All full size Doodle Pages are 11x17



2) Tiled

The tiled pages give you the option of printing the full sized Doodle Pages at home. You print the tiled pages and then assemble them to make the larger patterns.

The Doodle Page PDF files are typically laid out like this:

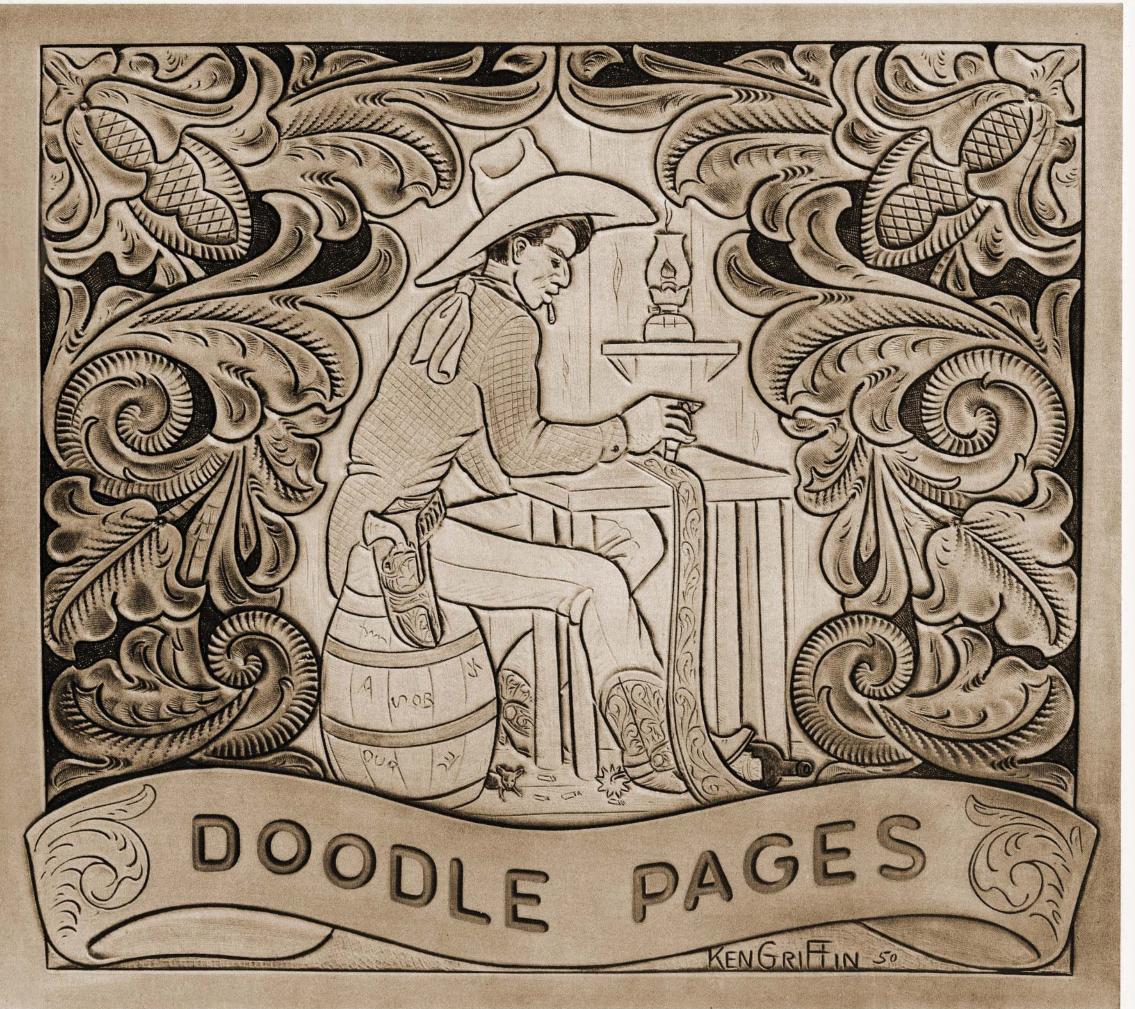
 $Front-full\ sized,\ front-tiled,\ back-full\ sized,\ back-tiled$

(Some Doodle Pages do not have backs)

Please note: When printing on a home printer, the edges may get cut off. To avoid this, make sure "Page Scaling" is set to "Shrink to Printable Area" in the Adobe Reader print dialogue box. This will decrease the size of the Doodle Page a very small amount.



You may take this PDF file to your local print shop to have the full-size pages printed for your own personal use.

This is the first page of a new series of doodle pages.

There will be a new page each month prepared by the foremost Western craftsmen. They will feature new floral designs, figure carving and the versatile use of CRAFTOOLS, each a lesson in itself. They will provide material and new ideas for creating your own designs and actually show how this is done.

As promised on Page 12 of Series 1, Ken Griffin comes through with a cover design for your doodle page album. It features a picture of Ken doing some first class doodling. The album will provide a medium of keeping your doodle pages for handy reference and much can be gained by studying the styles and techniques shown.

PROCEDURE:

Cut the leather $12''x27\frac{1}{2}''$, this will allow a 1'' margin plus $1\frac{3}{4}''$ to take care of the three ring binder.



Follow the same procedure as shown on Doodle page 4 of series 1. Line the album with suede or goat, trim the pages to fit the album. The printed instructions can be mounted with scotch tape on the back of the preceding page. Your Craft Dealer (listed below), will be glad to help you with any problems you may encounter.

Page 2 of Series 2 by Robert Moss of Phoenix, Arizona will show the right and wrong way to design a floral pattern. It will feature the use of buds and leaves to fill in large background areas.
