






TONY LAIER (Thomas Anthony Laier)



Cookie Cutter Leather Ornaments

1. Use your favorite Christmas cookie cutters and press them into cased 3 to 5 oz. veg tan leather. (Be careful. Some cutters have sharp edges.

Wear heavy gloves or use a poly mallet.)

2. Cut out the leather shapes using Super Shears or a craft knife. Use punches for tight rounded corners, then cut up to or away from

them with shears or knife.


- 3. Decorate shapes with carved, tooled or stamped designs.
- 4. Color with stains, Cova Color® or markers. Add a finish.
- 5. Add additional decorations with crystal rivets, spots, conchos, etc.

HINTS: To make the ornament two sided, cut a second shape using the first as a guide. Lay rough sides of leather together, trace and cut-out. Decorate, color, add a finish, then cement shapes together.


To add a photo, cut a window in one of the shapes, decorate, add color and a finish, then insert photo and cement shapes together.


> 6. Punch holes in tops and string with suede lace. Tie ends together in a knot or secure ends with decorative beads.

7. Be sure ornaments are signed and dated. These will become family heirlooms.















For family fun, make an ornament for each member of your family. Hang them individually or lace them together as a chain for your Christmas tree.








Information about Ben Moody:


Tooling Tips by Peter Main...series one



Taper your cut lines where the scrolls turn, then use a modeler to extend (complete) these areas. Do not bevel too deeply and be sure to use a modeling tool to smooth your work. When using the "hair blade" it will be necessary to hold it at an angle to start the flow in confined areas, thus avoiding leaving marks on the plain background leather.



Cut the leaf center veins lightly, as these should not be as deep as the outline of the design. Fade the background into the open areas of the design. Also use the background tool to define the sharp areas between the petals in the outer areas. Mat all the outlines of the design close to the edge, then repeat the process a little further out, using less weight to gradually fade matting into plain leather. This process eliminates the "beveling ridge" and gives the design greater relief.



This style of design lends itself well to the inverted style of carving. Like any pattern of this appearance, it requires critical tracing (if not using a Craftaid®) and perhaps correcting before cutting with your swivel knife. The technique required here to have perfect parallel lines (using dividers) can be found on page 3 of "Stohlman Step-by-Step". Also see page 19 of this book for information regarding the cutting of "inside points". As these lines are narrow and require inside beveling, a modeling tool will work a lot better than bevelers. The area within the right panel has been left open to add initials or motif.



This design is carved in the traditional way, but with an "inverted" outline for a clean and crisp appearance. Of course the outline can be beveled as it is normally done, and can have the beveling ridge showing or can be matted out into plain leather. Use dividers, as mentioned above, for the fine parallel lines and bevel with a modeling tool. A modeler is also used to mark the leaf center lines. The background area on the right side has space for the addition of initials or motif.



This design is carved in the traditional way with a beveled outline. This beveling ridge has been smoothed with a modeling tool to give a very defined and deliberate outline. Cut lightly on the center veins of the leaves, bevel these veins lightly as well. Ensure that the veiner that runs from the center veins, turns with the flow of the leaves. A fine background tool has been used here as those areas are very tight. Smooth all beveling and shading with a modeling tool.



The tracing of this design (if not using a Craftaid®) is critical and many require some revision with a stylus before using the swivel knife. This is where the use of dividers (as mentioned above in paragraph 3) is the only way to ensure perfect flowing parallel lines. Use a modeler for beveling the narrow lines and also for the matting of the areas within the center scrolls. The design on the right has space for an initial or motif. These can be beveled, or the area backgrounded.

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
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
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
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
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
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























Tooling Tips by Peter Main...series two



The carving instruction for this "Wild Berry" design can be found on page 19 in the book "Stohlman Step-by-Step", also page 3 shows how to cut perfect parallel lines. Cut and bevel lightly on the center veins of the leaves. The light cuts running off the center veins are added only after all beveling has been completed. If you wish to add a name to this design, simply eliminate the leaf in the right panel.... see below on how to do this.




This inverted design requires some careful cutting with your swivel knife. Follow the technique of cutting these stems found on page 3 of "Stohlman Step-by-Step". Do not cut too deeply in the fine parallel lines, and use a modeling tool to bevel the inside edges. Bevel lightly within the leaves and smooth all beveling with a modeling tool. If an initial or motif is to be added to the right panel... cut a piece of light leather to shape and tape it to the Craftaid® to block transfer of that part of the design.



The long flowing lines should be cut as mentioned above. Fade your cuts where the fine lines meet, especially at the inside points as shown on page 19 of "Stohlman Step-by-Step". When all beveling is complete, smooth with a modeling tool. This design may also be carved in the traditional way by beveling on the "outside" of the outline. The enclosed areas can then be backgrounded and dyed a dark color for contrast. The center part of the design that joins front and back panel can be left as is, without backgrounding.



The many lines that flow towards the center of this design must taper, and be completed (extended) with a modeling tool for a pleasing effect. The two "leaves" that extend to the right can be eliminated from being transferred (use light leather cut to shape as previously mentioned) if you wish to add initials to this design.




This pretty "inverted" design requires extreme care when cutting the long flowing stems. Use the technique (cutting parallel lines) shown on page 3 of "Stohlman Step-by Step" and review the cutting of inside tapering lines on page 19. Use a modeling tool to bevel the inside edges of the stems. Run the hair-blade in one continuous stroke over all the stem sections.




This "inverted" design can also be carved in the traditional way by beveling on the "outside" of the outline. A square area may be added to each side to frame the design if so desired. Use the cutting technique for the flowing parallel lines as mentioned above. Cut center veins on leaves lightly, and after beveling, add the hair-blade to these veins.
































