

This PDF file contains 1 (one) full pattern package. The PDF has been put together to give you options when it comes to printing. Pages and patterns that are larger than 8½x11 have been provided in two formats:



1) Full Size

If you would like to have a full size print out, take the full size pages to your local print shop and they can print it for you.

2) Tiled

The tiled pages give you the option of printing the larger patterns at home. You print the tiled pages and then assemble them to make the larger patterns.

The pattern PDF files are typically laid out like this:

Cover(if applicable), instructions sheets (if applicable), pattern 1 - full sized, pattern 1 - tiled, pattern 2 - full sized, pattern 2 - tiled, pattern 3 - full sized, pattern $3 - tiled \dots etc$

Please note: When printing on a home printer, the edges may get cut off. To avoid this, make sure "Page <u>S</u>caling" is set to "Shrink to Printable Area" in the Adobe Reader print dialogue box. This will decrease the size of the pattern a very small amount.



- 1. Make tracing and cutting patterns.
- 2. Cut project from leather, 4 or 5 oz. strap leather or tooling calf.
- 3. Moisten leather with sponge, allowing moisture to penetrate, then let surface dry until it has ALMOST turned to the original color.
- Transfer tracing design to cased leather, using 4H drawing pencil or stylus.
- Carve and stamp design, "see carving procedure".









1. Moisten edges of gusset then use wide faced hammer to form gussets, (as shown above). Forming edges of the gusset is very important to the future shape of the finished purse, also will allow easier lacing.





5. Sew tab to back piece A, sew under cen-ter of loop, which will next be covered with loop. After sewing, rubber cement will sufficiently hold loop ends, which should be skived to tapered end, to avoid Purchase writing tablet approximately 53/4" x 81/2" x 1/4" or more thick, secure by sliding back cover of tablet into slot, also place pencil in slot, as shown on photograph. After case is laced, use polished stick or folder on inside of pockets to loosen ce-ment which will allow maximum pocket expansion. Secure snap fastener POST, as marked on pattern. Skive all outer edges that are to be laced, crease and dye all exposed edges. Obtain small address book then glue or paste carved cover to the address book. Cement linings and pockets into position. Make tab and loop, line tab, secure fas-tener cap to lining only for hidden button. Cut out linings. Lace edges. mps.









- 2. Use large beveler No. 195 to bevel border lines, BEVEL TO INSIDE, which will raise the border as a protection from the stamp tools.
- 3. Pear-shading.
- 4. Barker tool on whirls.
- 5. Backgrounding
- Beveling, first use large beveler on all long straight cuts, next medium beveler.
- 7. Camouflager on all main stems.
- 8. Veining.
- 9. Use swivel knife to ornamental cut design, study photo, this is a very important step and practice is essential.
- 10. Mules Foot on acanthus.
- 11. Stamp Seed Pod.

- 4. Make tab and loop, line tab, secure fastener cap to lining only for hidden button.
- 5. Sew tab to back piece A, sew under center of loop, which will next be covered with loop. After sewing, rubber cement will sufficiently hold loop ends, which should be skived to tapered end, to avoid bumps.
- 6. Cement linings and pockets into position.
- 7. Lace edges.
- 8. Obtain small address book then glue or paste carved cover to the address book.
- 9. After case is laced, use polished stick or folder on inside of pockets to loosen cement which will allow maximum pocket expansion.
- Purchase writing tablet approximately 53¼" x 8½" x ¼" or more thick, secure by sliding back cover of tablet into slot, also place pencil in slot, as shown on photograph.





PROCEDURE

- 1. Make Cutting and Tracing patterns, place clear tracing paper over the photo, DO NOT trace ornamental cuts.
- Cut project from leather, tooling calf or 3-4 oz. strap.
- 3. Case leather by dampening, allowing moisture to penetrate grain, allow top surface of leather to dry until it has ALMOST returned to original color.
- Transfer tracing design to cased leather using No. 4 H drawing pencil or stylus. DO NOT include ornamental cuts, these are added after stamping is done.

CARVING PROCEDURE

 Swivel cut border lines, then flowers, leaves. stems. in this order.


- 12. Use large or medium beveler to re-bevel down all parts of the design touching the border, being careful not to touch background with the beveling tool.
- If initials are desired redampen that area and swivel cut outline of initials and tap bevel outlines.
- 14. Use modeling tool to depress background areas, (see photograph).

ASSEMBLY

- 1. Cut out linings.
- 2. Skive all outer edges that are to be laced, crease and dye all exposed edges.
- Secure snap fastener POST, as marked on pattern.

- 3. Moisten leather with sponge, allowing moisture to penetrate, then let surface dry until it has ALMOST turned to the original color.
- 4. Transfer tracing design to cased leather, using 4H drawing pencil or stylus.
- 5. Carve and stamp design, (see procedure).
- 6. Use woolskin pad to polish grain sides of the project. Polish each piece IMIMEDIATELY after carving is finished.
- 7. Skive all outside edges that are to be laced.


