



Saddle Holster Pattern

Tool with the included pattern or one of your own, then dye and stain.







This PDF file contains 1 (one) full pattern package. The PDF has been put together to give you options when it comes to printing. Pages and patterns that are larger than 8½x11 have been provided in two formats:



1) Full Size

If you would like to have a full size print out, take the full size pages to your local print shop and they can print it for you.



2) Tiled

The tiled pages give you the option of printing the larger patterns at home. You print the tiled pages and then assemble them to make the larger patterns.


The pattern PDF files are typically laid out like this:

Cover(if applicable), instructions sheets (if applicable), pattern 1 – full sized, pattern 1 – tiled, pattern 2 – full sized, pattern 2 – tiled, pattern 3 – full sized, pattern 3 – tiledetc

Please note: When printing on a home printer, the edges may get cut off. To avoid this, make sure "Page Scaling" is set to "Shrink to Printable Area" in the Adobe Reader print dialogue box. This will decrease the size of the pattern a very small amount.

NOTE: Digital kit patterns do not include any kit parts that they may reference.

NOTE: Some patterns may reference tools, and other items no longer available.




1. ATTACH STRAP HOLDERS: ASSEMBLING INSTRUCTIONS READ CAREFULLY

First, edge and burnish the four small strap holders. Then punch eight holes in the holster, using a #4 punch. Position holes as indicated on the pattern. Now attach strap holders with rivets. One strap holder to each set of



CEMENT EDGES:


Trim and burnish the edges on open end of hol-ster. Cement edges to be laced on flesh side. (Use rubber cement). Then dampen center area of evenly and press firmly together. holster and fold in half. Line up cemented edges

PUNCH LACING HOLES:


Begin lacing at top of holster. Cut end of latigo lace to a tapered point. Firmly fix your starting point by lacing through the first hole twice. Con-Repeat double lacing on last hole. tinue to next hole and so on to end of holster.




1. ATTACH STRAP HOLDERS:



. CEMENT EDGES:


Trim and burnish the edges on open end of holster. Cement edges to be laced on flesh side. (Use rubber cement). Then dampen center area of holster and fold in half. Line up cemented edges evenly and press firmly together.





3. PUNCH LACING HOLES:


Again, punch lacing holes with a #4 punch, beginning at the starting mark and punching to the end of holster. Space holes 3/6" apart, center to center (see illustration) and 1/4" center to edge.



RACING PATTERN

4. START LACING:

Begin lacing at top of holster. Cut end of latigo lace to a tapered point. Firmly fix your starting point by lacing through the first hole twice. Continue to next hole and so on to end of holster. Repeat double lacing on last hole.




5. FINISH STRAPS:

Trim and burnish edges of two saddle straps. Punch holes for buckle. Insert buckle, fold leather tip and rivet into place. Then starting 3" from the other tip end, punch six holes, 134" apart.






Attach holster to saddle by slipping top strap through hole in saddle fork. Buckle these strap rup strap and place second holster strap through ends together. Then slip holster underneath stirrear rigging ring. Buckle strap together. Insert FORK REAR



Step 5—Beveling
Use beveler to stamp down one side of cut
only. Push beveler along inside of swivel cut.
Smooth even bevel is very important.

Step 2—Carving
Use swivel knife to carve design. Cut outlines in the following order: flowers, stems,
leaves, scrolls, etc.

A. Use a sponge to dampen leather.

B. Spread the leather to be decorated grain or smooth side up on a smooth board.

Dampen the entire piece. Do not get leather sopping wet.

C. Use tracing paper to trace design outlines from pattern. Clip tracing to damp reset the outline of the design on leather with tracing tool or sharp pencil. If leather becomes dry, dampen it again. When it turns back to its natural color, resume work.

Step 6—Veiner - and Seeder
Use veiner to add decorative effect on
scrolls and flowers. Seeder to complete
flower centers.



ARVING INSTRUCTIONS



m pattern. Clip tracing to damp both side up on a smooth board.

Step 1—Tracing Design
Trace the outline of the design on leather with tracing tool or sharp pencil. If leather becomes dry, dampen it again. When it turns back to its natural color, resume work.



Step 4—Shading
Use shader to add shading or deep burnished color to leather . . . use on flower petals, leaves, etc.



Step 7—Background
Use background tool to stamp down background
areas, dark areas on pattern. Add decorative
cuts with your swivel krife.





Step 2—Carving
Use swivel knife to carve design. Cut.outlines in the following order: flowers, stems,
leaves, scrolls, etc.


